Leadership Responsibilities and Duties

Neighborhood Coordinator

Primary duties of Neighborhood Coordinator (NC):

Visit assigned neighbors (preferably in their homes).

Determine level of interest – politely leave those not interested alone.

Explain the 'Our Emergency Preparedness Plan' (OEPP) form (2 copies).

Provide training on how to use ivins.com website to obtain additional information.

Provide basic preparedness information, answer questions.

Follow up as needed – pickup from residents their completed OEPP form B.

Secondary duties

Help identify other potential NC candidates.

Retain OEPP form B obtained from residents and file for ready access for First Responders.

Become very familiar with resident responses to Emergency Resource & Skills List information.

On 'Disaster Day'

Do an assessment of assigned neighbors, both property and injury

Return completed assessment forms to Zone Leader at HUB Box

Zone Leader

Primary duties of Zone Leader

Identify and recruit NC's

Train NC's in their duties

Assist in the creation or realignment of neighborhood boundaries within the Zone

On 'Disaster Day'

Supervise the HUB Box operations

Review assessment forms received from resident volunteers and Neighborhood Coordinators

Radio assessment information via walkie-talkie to Area Coordinator

Area Coordinator

Primary duties of Area Coordinators

Identify and train Zone Leaders and NC's

Assist Zone Leaders with training NC's.

Maintain HUB Boxes in Area - check battery levels, replenish assessment forms, etc.

On 'Disaster Day'

Receive assessment information from Zone Leaders via walkie-talkie radio

Forward assessment information via police-style radio to Command Center
